








Bible Lesson


Pre-Primary

- Same story presented over 1-2 weeks
- Small portions of the story read daily
- Scholars are exposed to some components of depth and complexity during the Bible reading




Primary

- Same story presented over 1-2 weeks
- Small portions of the story read daily
- Scholars are introduced to some components of Depth and Complexity during and after the Bible reading



- One story studied all week
- Overview on Monday
- "Deep Dive" Tue-Thur
- LTL chart completed during each "Deep Dive"
- Pre-K Bible Journal illustrated each Friday



Whole Group Expectation

Pre-Primary

- 10 minutes or less
- Includes songs, fingerplays, stories, music and movement
- Teacher led 1 or 2 step directions and whole body movement
- Teacher led transitions



Primary

- Approximately 10 minutes
- Includes morning meeting, calendar, circle time, phonological awareness
- Call and response and whole body movement
- Guided transitions



- Approximately 20 minutes of sustained attention during instruction
- 30 minutes sustained attention while listening to fiction
- Internal pondering and the practice of waiting to share thoughts/questions
- Independent transitions



Small Group Expectation

Pre-Primary

- 10 minutes or less
- Includes songs, fingerplays, stories, music and movement
- Teacher led 1 or 2 step directions and whole body movement
- Teacher led transitions



- About 10-12 minutes
- Includes 3-4 scholars at a time
- Mostly teacher led instruction moving towards more independent work



- Teacher Table: About 15 minutes
 - $\circ~$ Usually 2-3 scholars
 - Scholar led activities with teacher guidance
- Literacy -20 minutes with independent rotations
- Math stations 20 minutes with independent rotations
- Scholars complete activities independently with teacher assistance to check for understanding





Learning Through Play

Pre-Primary

- 4 available stations (dramatic play, building, reading, etc)
- Parallel play with peers
- Cooperative play with teachers



Primary

- Structured groups and rotations (big building, dramatic play, sensory, literacy, etc)
- Includes 3-4 scholars at a time
- Cooperative play with teachers and peers



- About 50 minutes with independent rotations
- Includes 3 scholars per center
- Scholar led interactions to develop social/emotional skills needed to support learning



Rest Time

Pre-Primary

- Nap time from 12:00-1:30
- Most scholars sleep the entire time
- Can bring in items that are part of their nap routine at home



Primary

- Nap time from 12:00-1:30
- Some scholars may not sleep, but are expected to lay still and quiet on their mats
- Can bring in items that are part of their nap routine at home
- Assist in putting their nap mats away



- Self Smart time to reset and relax for about 20-30 minutes
- Scholars lay quiet and still on their towels
